Walk to the pub!

WITH OPTIONAL CHILDRENS' PARK ON ROUTE

THE GEORGE INN AT BARFORD ST MICHAEL IS OUR NEAREST PUB, JUST OVER A MILE AWAY.

It features a welcoming atmosphere, beer garden, ample seating, and a variety of food and drinks. Family-friendly and perfect for children and dogs, you can reach it by a scenic footpath or a quiet road.

Below are directions for a pleasant two-mile round trip, with an optional park visit for those with children.

1. Exit the Farm

Turn right out of Spring Hill Farm



2. Road to Footpath:

Follow the road and go around the sharp bend (you will see a barn on the left) and continue walking for approximately 200 meters. Take the footpath—through the gate on the left.

3. Headland Path:

Walk along the headland, keeping the hedge on your right. At the end of the hedge, take the path diagonally to your left toward the gap in the hedge across the field.



4. Cross the Field:

From the gap, head across the field to the hedge on the left-hand side.



5. Hedge Line:

Continue with the hedge on your left for approximately 450 meters and then take the footpath to your left. Go through the gate.



6. Church Path:

You will soon see Barford St Michael Church ahead of you. Walk through the Church yard and take the gate out of the Church to your right once you reach the top of the path.



7. Village Road:

Take the road ahead through the village, keeping the village green to your right. Turn left onto Murrey's Lane.



Children's Park Option:

If you would like to visit the park, cross the road (Murray's Lane) and enter through the gate. To rejoin the route, exit through the gate at the bottom left corner of the park. The pub is just around the corner!



8. Final Stretch to the Pub:

Turn left at the grass triangle; the pub is ahead on your right.



9. Return to Spring Hill Farm - Via Road:

Turn right out of the pub.

10. Passing the Church:

Continue along the road, heading out of the village. The church will now be on your left.



11. Conker Avenue:

Take the avenue (South Newington Road), locally known as 'conker avenue' due to the horse chestnut trees lining the road).

12. Barley Lane:

At the top of the road, turn left and continue along Barley Lane for approximately 400 meters until you reach the farm entrance on you right.
